Mari Spirito Paragraph Biography

Mari Spirito is Executive Director and Curator of Protocinema, a cross-cultural, ambulatory art organization commissioning and presenting exhibitions and public programs in Istanbul and New York, which she founded in 2011. In 2023 co-curated *Art, Ancestors, Ghosts & The Dead* convening on attitudes towards death across cultures; curator of *The Myth of Normal, A Celebration of Authentic Expression* group exhibition at MassArt Art Museum, Boston, forthcoming in October; and completed Contemplative Care Foundations Program, New York Zen Center. In 2020, developed and presented a new exhibition model *A Few In Many Places,* a multi-city group exhibition, Beirut, Istanbul, Berlin, Montreal, and Philadelphia, that maintains a foot in physical real-life in each community, while utilizing far-reaching digital support structures, thoughtfuly-local and globally interconnected. In 2021, this format took place in Seoul, Bangkok, Istanbul, New York, Santurce, and Guatemala City, all of these interventions use sustainable exhibition-making models of reducing exploitation (of natural resources, labor and knowledge) and consumption (no shipping or flying). In 2015 she initiated the Protocinema Emerging Curator Series Mentorship program, which partnered with The Clemente Soto Vélez Cultural & Educational Center, New York, in 2022. From 2013 to 2018 she programmed the Conversations program for both Art Basel and Art Basel Miami Beach. Spirito served as International Advisory Committee Member for the Inaugural High Line Plinth Commissions, New York, 2017; curator/director of Alt Art Space, Bomonti, Istanbul 2015 - 2017; Advisor to the 2nd Mardin Biennial, Turkey, 2012; director of 303 Gallery New York from 2000 - 2012. She is on the Board of Participant Inc, New York, and holds a BFA from Massachusetts College of Art, Boston.

In 2020 Spirito was commissioning curator of Theo Triantafyllidis' *Anti-Gone* mixed-media performance premiered at Sundance Film Festival, New Frontier; *Artist Making Music* a video by Sub-Botnick (Ahmet Oğüt & Maru Mushtrieva) co-commissioned with inaugural Asia Society Triennial: "We Do Not Dream Alone", 2021. In 2019 wrote *Flies Bite, It's Going To Rain* catalog text on Vajiko Chachkhiani's installation of the same name; curated public talks for Beijing Art Summit, Ullens Center for Contemporary Art, Beijing. UCCA, 798 Art District. Faculty for Independent Curators International (ICI) Curatorial Intensive, Bangkok; guest curator, Alserkal Arts Foundation Public Commission, Dubai, with Hale Tenger, 2018. Launched Protocinema Screening Tour 2017. Protocinema partnered with Artspace, Sydney for "Australia and Turkey Visiting Curators Initiative", 2014. Spirito is on Advisory Committees of: AGYU, Art Gallery of York University, Toronto; Art Unlimited Magazine, and Boarder_less, Istanbul.
